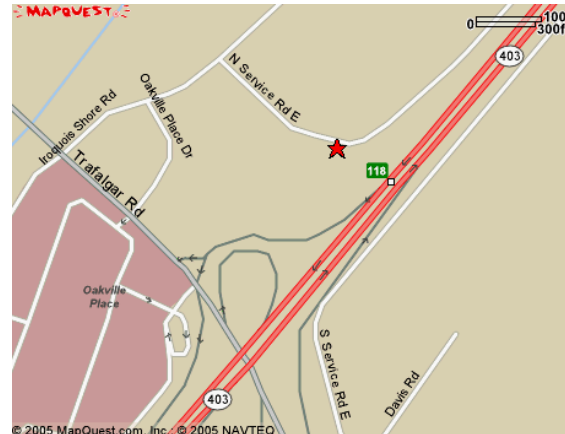

## SERVICES OFFERED

### **Audiology (Children and Adults)**

- Diagnostic hearing assessment including advanced tests of hearing, word discrimination ability, and middle ear function
- Assessment of Central Auditory Processing (CAP) ability for individuals with listening and/or learning difficulties
- Hearing aid prescription, sale, fitting, and follow-up including regular monitoring of hearing status, hearing aids, FM systems, and other assistive listening devices
- ADP authorizer/vendor, DVA provider

### **Fast ForWord Program**

- Computer generated, state of the art, remedial program for children with language-learning impairments and reading difficulties
- Offered in-centre, in-home, and school-based

### **Resource Library**

- Reference books, reprints, and articles available to professionals, centre clients, and the public
- Videotapes (communication and hearing disorders)
- Materials for the treatment of communication disorders and hearing impairments

### **Workshops**

- In-service training and professional development available on a variety of topics within the fields of audiology and speech-language pathology

## SERVICES OFFERED

### **Speech-Language Pathology**

- Assessment, diagnosis of speech and language disorders and/or delays, and intervention
  - Speech disorders (articulation, phonology, and motor speech difficulties—apraxia)

  - Language and developmental delays
  - Language-learning disabilities
  - Reading, spelling, and written language deficits or delays
